

# *Testimony Spiritual Delegated Authority*

Thank God for His continued mercy for America! (Lamentations 3:22-23)

As believers in Christ Jesus, we can defend our country through prayer and exercising our delegated authority over the kingdom of Satan. **Not only our country, but all areas of our jurisdiction.** (Matthew 12:26)

Realize that there is a **difference** between prayer and using our delegated authority.

Jesus prayed! (John 17th chapter) Jesus used His authority against Satan! (Matthew 16:23)  
We are to do what Jesus did. (John 14:12)

The video “**Delegated Authority**” reveals at least one way to defend America **and our areas of jurisdiction.**

## **Lamentations 3:22-23 (AMP)**

“It is because of the Lord's mercy and loving-kindness that we are not consumed, because His [tender] compassions fail not. 23 They are new every morning; great and abundant is Your stability and faithfulness.”

## **Matthew 12:26 (AMP)**

“And if Satan drives out Satan, he has become divided against himself and disunified; how then will his kingdom last or continue to stand?”

## **Matthew 16:23 (AMP)**

“But Jesus turned away from Peter and said to him, Get behind Me, Satan! You are in My way [an offense and a hindrance and a snare to Me]; for you are minding what partakes not of the nature and quality of God, but of men.”

## **John 14:12 (AMP)**

“I assure you, most solemnly I tell you, if anyone steadfastly believes in Me, he will himself be able to do the things that I do; and he will do even greater things than these, because I go to the Father.”

## **Ephesians 6:18 (AMP)**

“Pray at all times (on every occasion, in every season) in the Spirit, with all [manner of] prayer and entreaty. To that end keep alert and watch with strong purpose and perseverance, interceding in behalf of all the saints (God's consecrated people).”

## **Luke 10:19 (AMP)**

“Behold! I have given you authority and power to trample upon serpents and scorpions, and [physical and mental strength and ability] over all the power that the enemy [possesses]; and nothing shall in any way harm you.”

### **Three areas to consider:**

1. The Lord's mercy. (Lamentations 3:22-23)
2. All prayer. (Ephesians 6:18)
3. Delegated authority. (Luke 10:19)

### **The verse demons hate:**

When I first started out as a believer in Christ Jesus, I encountered a demon-possessed lady. It was at my first church. It began after I preached a sermon. At the end of my sermon, God spoke these words through me, which I did not fully understand then, but I do now. Basically, I said this; "There is someone in here who has something deep in them." After I taught, I went to the front of the church building to drink some water. Then, I heard a very loud scream from a lady. Therefore, I went to see what the commotion was all about. When I approached the lady, others were around her as well speaking the name of Jesus. I heard them say, "Come out in Jesus' name!"

Realize that I was young in the Lord and came from a quiet Catholic background. I thought to myself, (as far as I can remember) "I am going to get in this!" So, I did!

In the process of setting this lady free (along with other believers) from these demons, I quoted and read several verses experimenting on how all this worked. However, **one verse** I quoted which I still use to this day is the verse the demon hated the most. (There were several demons in this lady) One person who witnessed this said, at least eleven demons came out and they had names and spoke their names out loud when I asked them with a commanding tone.

Every time I quoted **the verse** the demon would scream through the lady. Although I quoted the verse, which made the demon scream, it was the authority of the name of Jesus that set her free. I learned that it is not just quoting a verse or verses but also obeying what the verses say and know **who I am in Christ**.

She was set free and I learned a lot in my first demon class with the Holy Spirit, my Teacher. Thank the Lord for His mercy and tender compassion!
